## PREFACE

The substances which affect the central nervous system, creating physical or mental problems and which arouse the desire to consume more depending on continuous use and which evoke the need for use when they are not taken are called narcotics.

Drug abuse not only disrupts physical and mental health, but also may cause deaths and undermine social structure with social and legal problems it creates.

Drugs are a problem not only for our country, but also for the entire world.

It is crucial to coordinate the anti-drug efforts and monitor and assess these efforts.

For this purpose, an "Anti-Drug Supreme Council" was formed in 2014 to be presided by a Deputy Prime Minister and consisting of 8 ministers (Minister of Family and Social Policies, Minister of Justice, Minister of Labor and Social Security, Minister of Youth and Sports, Minister of Internal Affairs, Minister of National Education, Minister of Customs and Commerce, and Minister of Health). Subordinated to this council, the Anti-Drug Council and the Anti-Drug Technical Council were formed and strong coordination structure was established.

Given the fact that addictive substances are permeable among each other, we targeted the highest level of strong cooperation in the anti-drug efforts. Along these lines, we restructured the existing councils under the title of "High Council for Dependence Prevention" in 2017. We ensured the participation of three more ministers (Minister of Food, Agriculture and Livestock, Minister of Finance, and Minister of Transport, Maritime Affairs and Communications) to the council, where eight ministers were previous members.

Thus, we employed an integrated approach to the existing efforts that were characterized with unflinching policies and multidisciplinary approaches that sought to counter the use of tobacco, alcohol, drug and other addictive substances as well as bad habits like technology dependence and gambling, accompanied with physical and mental hazards for individuals and community.

With the delicacy of the matter at hand, we prioritized the Action Plan consisting of anti-drug efforts.

All units that function in the anti-drug field in our country will implement the National Anti-Drug Action Plan and Strategic Document for the period 2018-2023 with determination. I sincerely believe it.

I hope the Action Plan will contribute to beneficial work for our children and young people as well as our society.

## PREFACE

As synthetic cannabinoid drugs made forays into our country first in 2011, spreading among younger people in particular, social sensitivity regarding it increased.

In response to this sensitivity, the public authorities re-evaluated the ongoing work and identified the need for new measures. While prevention of supply is a key element of anti-drug efforts, we implemented a multi-stakeholder prevention vision at the highest level against this multi-dimensional public health problem with legal, social and health consequences.

With this vision, we developed the Anti-Drug Urgent Action Plan and Strategic Document, which prioritized certain measures, in 2015. Then, National Anti-Drug Action Plan and Strategic Document was formulated for the period 2016-2018 to reinforce these efforts with new strategies.

In the National Anti-Drug Action Plan and Strategic Document 2018-2023, we defined our goal "to keep society away from all sorts of stimulant and drug abuse" and set 16 indicators and targets related to this goal. We prepared all initiatives and activities in the supply, demand, communication and coordination dimensions to ensure the achievement of this goal. We produced this document with contribution from 132 people and through 28 meetings that lasted for more than 700 hours.

The Strategic Document and Action Plan thus developed aims to guide the anti-drug activities in the coming 6 years, strengthen the coordination of the efforts throughout the country, monitor impact through defined indicators and targets and achieve success. I would like to thank everyone who contributed to the Action Plan and Strategic Document. I believe that the implementation of the action plan will be carried out with a similar determination and be of benefit to our nation.

# INTRODUCTION

Substances which are derived from plants and/or chemically generated synthetic molecules and which affect the central nervous system, creating physically and/or mentally sedative and/or stimulating effects and which arouse the desire to consume more depending on continuous use and which evoke the need for use when they are not taken are called narcotic drugs. Continuing to use such substances despite their catastrophic effects is defined as drug addiction.

In addition to a number of health problems, drug addiction creates major social, economic and security problems. This complicated, multidimensional, and ever-growing problem that is increasingly becoming a concern for the entire world entails a total fight involving all social segments. In this regard, ministries, institutions, local administrations, and civil society organizations have important roles to play.

In fighting drug abuse which is a major public health problem, the key point is to prevent access to drugs. Our primary aim in anti-drug efforts is to protect the individuals who have never started to use drugs. In addition, facilitating access to counseling, detoxification, treatment and rehabilitation services for drug addicts, providing treatment for them and their reintegration with social life are indispensable components of anti-drug efforts.

Due to its geographical location and its young population, our country is a target country for drug trade. For this reason, it is crucial to enhance the units that combat drug supply as well as the units that have duties in other areas and to strengthen their capacities.

Of course, the most critical factor for success is to ensure coordinated work and monitoring and evaluation of the work undertaken. Therefore, the Anti-Drug Supreme Council was established with the Prime Ministry Circular numbered 2014/19. In this context, 2015 Anti-Drug Urgent Action Plan and Anti-Drug Strategic Document and 2016-2018 National Anti-Drug Action Plan and National Anti-Drug Strategic Document entered into force. The details of the activities undertaken in this framework were given in 2014-2017 Anti-Drug Activity Report, which is accessible at [www.saglik.gov.tr](http://www.saglik.gov.tr).

People dependent on addictive substances tend to shift from one to another. There is need for fighting each of them effectively. Therefore, the High Council for Dependence Prevention was created by the Prime Ministry Circular dated 9 December 2017 and numbered 2017/23, by broadening the scope of the Anti-Drug Supreme Council. The Council which is chaired by a Deputy Prime Minister includes 11 Ministers (i.e. Justice; Family and Social Policies; Labor and Social Security; Youth and Sports; Food, Agriculture and Livestock; Customs and Trade; Internal Affairs; National Education; Health; and Transportation, Maritime Affairs and Communications). The Circular also provides that the Chairman of the High Council is authorized to set up committees, sub-committees, technical committees, ad hoc and permanent working groups and provincial and district committees.

Within this context, the Council of Dependence Prevention and the following technical working groups for dependence prevention were established by the decision of the Chairman dated 23.12.2017 and numbered 71366025-990: Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Tobacco Dependence, Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Drugs, Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Alcohol Dependence, Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Behavioral Dependence (e.g. technology and gambling) and Technical Working Group on Communication in Dependence Prevention.

The Council of Dependence Prevention chaired by the Parliamentary Commission on Health, Family, Labor and Social Affairs consists of deputy undersecretaries of the relevant 12 ministries (Justice; Family and Social Policies; Labor and Social Security; Foreign Affairs; Youth and Sports; Food, Agriculture and Livestock; Customs and Commerce; Internal Affairs; Finance; National Education; Health; and Transport, Maritime Affairs and Communications), 2 general directors (Directorate General of Press and Information; and Turkish Green Crescent Society), 1 president (Financial Crimes Investigation Board), 3 vice-presidents (Radio and Television Supreme Council; the Turkish Statistical Institute; and the Department of Religious Affairs), Advisor of the Chairman of the High Council for Dependence Prevention and representatives of 19 relevant institutions and organizations. Technical Working Group on Dependence Prevention coordinated by Ministry of Health Deputy Undersecretary comprises representatives who are department heads or above of the 20 institutions/organizations which are members of the CDP. Pursuant to the Circular, the secretarial services of these bodies as well as coordination and follow-up will be carried out by the Directorate General of Public Health led by the respective Deputy Undersecretary at national level and provincial health directorates led by the governors in the provinces.

Due to the restructured councils, we decided to update the Strategic Document and Action Plans which constitute a road map for anti-drug efforts. In this context, international good practices, strategies and activities which were found to create significant impact were reviewed. Policy labs were created to engage all stakeholders including the relevant ministries, public institutions and civil society organizations. Strategic goals were created. To achieve these goals, final indicators and data sources were defined. Impact analyses were planned for all activities designed to develop anti-drug policies.

Anti-drug efforts are implemented in coordination with all the Ministries which are members of the High Council for Dependence Prevention and other institutions and organizations. Likewise, the process of monitoring, evaluating and reporting the anti-drug efforts which are implemented based on scientific evidence regularly and strongly conducted. Measurements of the effectiveness of the work conducted and implementation of the decision support and early warning systems will be crucial for the sound functioning of coordination.

An important factor for success is to cascade the policies in the action plan down to the local level. Strategies and road maps were developed jointly with CSOs, local administrations and other social and civil initiatives.

Dissemination of the activities under the action plan and regular media briefings to be held by the officials for securing public support are very important. Therefore, activities will be reported annually and the public will be properly informed in a timely manner.

The Strategic Document and Action Plan thus developed aims to guide the anti-drug activities in the coming 6 years, strengthen the coordination of the efforts throughout the country, monitor impact through defined indicators and targets and achieve success.

# Methodology

- ✓ Results of policy labs where challenges, recommendations for solution and necessary activities were discussed.

The National Anti-Drug Strategic Document and Action Plan 2018-2023 was planned at four levels:



The first level of the Plan includes a "Goal" and the "Goal Indicators and Targets" which will be used for monitoring. The first level of the Plan includes "Aims" and "Aim Indicators and Targets" used to achieve the goal. Levels three and four consist of the "Initiatives" and "Activities" to achieve the targets. Clearly, indicators and yearly targets have been set for activities.

The baseline values in the indicator cards which will help monitor the progress will be derived out of the sources given in the heading "Data Source." Where data is lacking or data measurement needs to be repeated or measurement of the indicator is yet to start, data will be collected either through surveys or by producing it in the existing system. In this respect, targets for given data will be updated as the current status data for a specific activity or target is updated.

**\*Waste Water Epidemiology**

*Waste water analysis is recommended as an alternative epidemiological method which may provide information about the drug abuse quantities, types of drugs used and usage pattern and which may be repeated more frequently. People tend to conceal their drug abuse due to the stigma potential. It can be difficult to achieve objective information through questionnaires. Waste water analysis is a rapidly evolving scientific discipline, and it has the potential to offer objective and real-time data concerning geographic and temporal trends in illicit drug use at the community level.<sup>1</sup> Sewage Analysis CORE group Europe (SCORE), established in 2010 to work across Europe, performed the first waste water drug analysis in 19 European countries in 2011.<sup>2</sup> Following the success of this project, waste water analysis has been conducted in 53 cities in 20 countries during the next four years.<sup>3</sup> Through waste water analysis that has become increasingly widespread, samples can be collected simultaneously in certain cities and countries and comparative results can be published.*

The activities to be conducted in connection with the initiatives created in line with goal indicators and targets were planned in the National Anti-Drug Action Plan. The "Sub-Activity Follow-Up Table" to be prepared to identify the detailed sub-activities of the activities will be used to monitor the sub-activities and the related monthly targets simultaneously.

# Aims

Aims under the four main categories below will help achieve the goal:

1

**Aim of Prevention of Drug Supply:**

To prevent production, use, distribution, street sale, national and international smuggling of all sorts of natural or synthetic drugs as well as chemical intermediates used in their production in order to prevent access to drugs.

2

**Aim of Prevention of Demand for Drugs:**

To inform and raise aware of target groups about harmful effects of drugs; facilitate access of drug addicts and their relatives to counseling, treatment and rehabilitation units; ensure that drug addicts are treated and rehabilitated to become individuals who are beneficial to society through reintegration mechanisms.

**Aim of Communication in Anti-Drug Efforts:**

To define the outlines of a general communication strategy which will represent a common perspective for all stakeholders and ensure joint action in anti-drug efforts, follow up and audit the activities within this framework, and raise public awareness about the activities conducted.

**Aim of Coordination, Monitoring and Evaluation of Anti-Drug Process:**

To maintain the strong coordination by enhancing cooperation between the central and local institutions/organizations in anti-drug efforts and monitor and evaluate the activities conducted.

*Prevention of Drug Supply*

# 1. Prevention of Drug Supply

Prevention of drug supply is a key component of anti-drug efforts and it should be assessed in multiple dimensions. The reason for this is the broad scope of drug-related crimes. While the crimes related to the sale of drugs may come to the mind first, there are sub-dimensions concerning the cultivation, production, transportation, possession, purchase, sale and use of drugs as well. In addition, the chemical substances which are used in the production of drugs and which are controlled under the international conventions to which our country is a party constitute another key area of anti-drug efforts. Situated on the routes of illicit drug trade due to its geopolitical location, our country is naturally affected by the smuggling of synthetic drugs, opium and its derivatives and chemical intermediates. To inform interventions of the dimensions and magnitude of this impact, it is critical for prevention of drug supply to create country and regional risk maps. Drug trafficking is a dynamic and complex process consisting of production, distribution and street sales of drugs.

***Purity-Adjusted Price***

*The efforts to combat drug supply seek to reduce the quantity of drugs available in the market and make it more difficult to access to drugs. The success of the efforts to prevent drug supply is expected to increase drug prices and studies indicate that increased prices reduce drug abuse. On the other hand, the drug market resists the price increases by reducing the purity of the products sold. Therefore, it is recommended to use "purity-adjusted price" to monitor the success of the efforts to combat drug supply. For instance, as the access to a 40-percent pure drug that is sold for TL 100 per gram becomes difficult, it will be sold at an increased price or its producer will try to maintain the same price by lowering its purity. Compared to a 20-percent pure drug that is sold at 100 TL per gram, the purity-adjusted price of a 40-percent pure drug will be  $100/0.40 = TL 250$  and that of a 20-percent drug will be  $100/0.20 = TL 500$ . As seen in this example, if monitoring efforts employ solely prices for raw substances, then the efforts to fight drug supply will seem insufficient. However, if purity-adjusted prices are used, the parameter employed will measure the efforts to prevent drug supply more correctly.*

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The crime of drug trafficking is an organized crime which has international aspects and is linked to many other crimes including violent crimes, border violations, and terrorism. There are extensive efforts to prevent drug trafficking, which is a global problem, particularly by enhancing security of borders and border crossings. Technological developments related to border security are closely monitored and the efforts to increase the capacity of the border security staff will continue. In addition, cooperation with neighbors and international organizations will be maintained for the prevention of such crimes as drug trafficking and trade.

Efforts to ensure early detection of new psychoactive substances and chemical intermediates used in their composition as well as their inclusion in the scope of the Early Warning System will be sustained in coordination with the relevant organizations. Introduction of NARKOTİM police squads for street-level fight against drug supply has enhanced street security. The number of NARKOTİM squads will be increased and their capacities will be enhanced in terms of technical equipment and staff. Street-level combat against drug dealers has been one of the most effective steps for the protection of our citizens. The activities of NARKOTİM squads will be increased in the vicinity of educational institutions, dormitories, hospitals, military barracks, places of worship, etc. On the other hand, the efforts to combat drug-related crimes committed through IT and cargo transport will be boosted.

Anti-drug efforts should be multifaceted. In this regard, detection and prevention of the money gained illegally will be a significant part of the anti-drug efforts. The main goal here is to bring down national or international cartels. All institutions and organization concerned will continue to work in this regard.

## Prevention of Drug Supply

## 1.1. Aim of Prevention of Drug Supply

Preventing production, use, distribution, street sale, national and international smuggling of all sorts of natural or synthetic drugs as well as intermediate chemicals used in their production.

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## 1.3 Initiatives and Activities of Prevention of Drug Supply

### 1. Prevent entry of drugs and precursors to our country, their exit from our country, by land, air, sea or with postal/cargo services through our borders and border crossings

- ✓ Strengthen human resources, vehicle, technique equipment and management capacities of border crossings which are located in risky locations in terms of drug trafficking within the framework of the modernization of border crossings and customs areas,

### 2. Prevent transport and sale of drugs inside the country

- ✓ Boost the number and effectiveness of NARKOTİM squads for street-level combat,
- ✓ Scale up the "Area Control Project" application with a view to increasing captures and including other law enforcement units in the anti-drug efforts,
- ✓ Enhance technical equipment, vehicle, material and staff capacities of the law enforcement units connected to the Ministry of Internal Affairs,
- ✓ Introduce regulations concerning bonuses given to the deserving officers who confiscate drugs,
- ✓ Prevent drug trade done through information technologies,

### 3. Enhance cooperation and communication among the units that seek to prevent supply of drugs for more effective efforts to counter drug trafficking

- ✓ Allow access by the institutions conducting anti-drug efforts to the data by the Turkish National Police (TNP) and the General Command of Gendarmerie (GCG) such as those relating to photos and fingerprints as well as the Passport Tracking System (PTS),
- ✓ Make the profiling work conducted by the crime lab of the General Command of Gendarmerie (GCG) available for the institutions conducting anti-drug efforts,
- ✓ Update the relevant legislation to allow the TNP's Criminal Department to perform profiling,
- ✓ Create an information archive concerning organized crime syndicates and street drug dealers for use by the relevant law enforcement units,
- ✓ Set up a new working group/committee within the scope of the drug trafficking data in order to create a system that will identify the risks and define solutions that may be developed in connection with these risks by assessing the existing data,

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- ✓ Make the hotel records (ID notification system) and General Information Gathering (GIG) system data to the law enforcement units which are involved in anti-drug efforts and which do not have access to such data,

### **4. Prevent illegal drug shipments by cargo**

- ✓ Install X-ray machines at cargo collection centers in the provinces with high rates of drug trafficking by domestic cargo,
- ✓ Share the data from domestic cargo companies with the units involving in anti-drug efforts,

### **5. Monitor the financial dimension of drugs and inhibit incomes from drug trade and prevent drug trade from being a financial source for the terrorist organization**

- ✓ Ensure that the FCIB gives training to law enforcement staff elected by law enforcement authorities and financial information is simultaneously shared in centrally planned operations,
- ✓ Establish a separate unit within the FCIB for the determination of the income obtained from drug trade,
- ✓ Conduct efforts to detect the illicit drug cultivation fields and ensure continuous control over them using technological developments,

### **6. Ensure effective participation of other units than anti-drug units in anti-drug efforts with a view to combating drug supply in an integrated manner**

- ✓ Ensure the demolition or restoration of derelict buildings,
- ✓ Identify the drug-related risks at and around the educational institutions and take necessary precautions,
- ✓ Identify missing security cameras, demolished fences and security guard needs of the educational institutions located in risky districts and take measures to eliminate these shortcomings,
- ✓ Install security camera systems around schools and integrate them with the Urban Security Management System (USMS),
- ✓ Conducting security clearances regularly for the people who will be employed in the provision of auxiliary services for educational institutions (including cleaning staff, security guards, canteen workers, drivers and other staff of school shuttle buses),

### **7. Undertake the fight against new psychoactive substances within the framework of the Early Warning System**

- ✓ Make risk assessments for new psychoactive substances which are seen or which have the potential to be seen in our country and follow up the process of placing them under the scope of the Law numbered 2313 without delay,



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### **8. Establish a system for providing the flow of information concerning the sale and distribution of drugs to law enforcement authorities and increase the number of information sources**

- ✓ Raise awareness of people on the basis of neighborhoods and streets and report cases of drug use and sale to the authorities to make living spheres more secure and healthy, and, to this end, provide narcoguide training on prevention of drug supply for private security guards, headmen, tradesmen, municipal police, municipal sanitation workers, building managers/officers, site security officers, etc.,

### **9. Place emphasis on pre- and post-crime work that seeks to uncover all aspects of organizations involved in criminal drug investigations**

- ✓ Strengthen the units which will conduct criminal intelligence analysis,
- ✓ Make use of new technological developments in the work on criminal intelligence analysis,

### **10. Support the work on international cooperation in anti-drug efforts**

- ✓ Maintain and increase the international controlled delivery applications,
- ✓ Appoint anti-drug liaison officer to major countries in the anti-drug efforts,
- ✓ Ensure the active participation of the experts from the relevant institutions in the international activities (meetings, conferences, seminars, workshops, etc.) organized by the international and regional organizations in the field of anti-drug efforts and host certain activities in compliance with the country's capacities when needed and, in particular, exert efforts for the establishment, and ensure sustainability of, an international organization that will place emphasis on our country's leadership for neighboring countries,

### **11. Scale up model practices for fighting drug supply**

- ✓ Ensure that model and novel work conducted for the fight against drug supply at the local level is shared by central law enforcement units,

### **12. Enhance cooperation and information sharing between law enforcement authorities and other related institutions and organizations**

- ✓ Organize mutual and/or joint training activities, workshops, operation and working meetings among law enforcement units for operational as well as information and experience exchanging purposes.

## 2. Prevention of Demand for Drugs

The efforts geared toward the prevention of demand for drugs in our country are conducted within the framework of protecting the individuals who have never started to use drugs, providing counseling and treatment support for the people who have used drugs and ensuring that drug addicts are treated and those who are treated receive reintegration services.

Drug use is a major problem that affects not only a certain social segment, but also the entire society; however, in the work to be conducted, risk groups should be contacted and special efforts should be exerted concerning these groups. The process of trying drugs changes depending on environmental and personal characteristics. During the childhood and adolescence, cognitive abilities continue to develop, and therefore, impulsive behavior is more frequent in these periods. Risky behaviors such as trying drugs may be observed more frequently in these periods. This is the main reason why drug dealers primarily target children and adolescents. Precautions to be taken in educational institutions for the protection of children and adolescents and the protective programs to be conducted are important.

### ***Most Important Target Group: Youth***

*Young people constitute the most important target group in the anti-drug efforts. It is crucial to make young people internalize the importance of staying healthy and the negative effects of substance use in a way to elicit behavioral changes. Studies emphasize the importance of receiving negatives messages about drug abuse from multiple sources, such as peers, families, teachers, role models, faith leaders, employers and media outlets, at home, school, workplace and throughout their lives repeatedly.<sup>1,2</sup> While drug use trends may be influenced by a number of social and cultural factors, drug abuse levels of young people decline if they really perceive drugs as harmful.<sup>3</sup>*

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The continuation of the training of guidance counselors on drug abuse will be ensured and the training will be scaled up to administrators, major teachers and other auxiliary staff. Necessary measures will be taken to scale up, and boost the efficiency of, the Addiction Prevention Training Program of Turkey, which is implemented with cooperation among the Ministry of National Education and the Turkish Green Crescent Society, and the program will be updated based on impact analysis results. In addition, the measures to be taken to make schools and their surrounding more secure in a physical sense should be maintained with determination. The counseling activities at schools, individual and group psychological counseling, family training, supporting students with low academic success and absence and late arrivals in schools, special training activities, training for shuttle bus drivers and canteen personnel and similar activities will continue to be conducted with diligence within the framework of anti-drug efforts. Also, efforts should be made expediently to engage all segments of society in anti-drug efforts. On the other hand, measures will continue to be taken to ensure that students do not have to quit school prematurely due to drug abuse and intervention programs are developed for the students who are left outside the education system.

Exposure of individuals to drugs is not a problem unique to the districts with low socio-economic levels. Yet, it is also true that certain risk groups such as individuals living in low socio-economic districts can be exposed to drugs more easily. Traumatic events of childhood, neglect/abuse, chaotic household environment, drug abuse in the family and/or immediate environment, and residence in districts with intense drug abuse can be listed as factors that increase the risk of drug abuse. Likewise, those who stay in the communal living environments like military units, prisons, dormitories, and boarding schools are risky areas for which special programs should be conducted.

For success in drug addiction treatment, a holistic approach must be sustained. The process starts with counseling services. Detoxification, treatment and rehabilitation processes are followed by the reintegration process which seeks to prevent relapse and facilitate participation in social life.

191 Anti-Drug Consultation and Support Hotline will continue to provide counseling services on a 24-hour basis. At this stage, 191 Hotline:

- ✓ the families who seek to receive information about what they can do to prevent family members from starting to use drugs in future although no one in their environment uses drugs,
- ✓ those who seek to be informed about how to determine if their relatives from risky groups are using drugs although they do not know if any of their relatives are currently using drugs,

### *Prevention of Demand for Drugs*

- ✓ those who seek to learn how to help drug abusers in their families or inner circle,
- ✓ the drug addicts who seek to quit drug abuse,
- ✓ the drug addicts who suffer from withdrawal effects for failing to use drugs,
- ✓ those who suffer from various problems in the process of quitting drug abuse,
- ✓ the relatives of the individuals who suffer from serious health problems due to drug abuse, offer services for:

A website has been set up for raising public awareness about the hotline counseling services. In this context, coordination will be ensured between the hotlines of the Ministry of Health and the Green Crescent Society.

Ensuring fast access to counseling services is the first stage for taking measuring before the development of addiction. Therefore, it is of great importance to enhance early diagnosis and early intervention mechanisms. Active inclusion of family physicians who represent the point of first contact between society and the health system helps reinforce the process. Family physicians have already been given training on early diagnosis and intervention for individuals from risk groups in terms of drug abuse. The aim of this training was to ensure that family physicians can provide counseling services for drug users and refer them to treatment services. These training programs will be extended in scope and cascaded to auxiliary health officers in primary care. Establishment and scaling-up of counseling centers in all provinces and big districts in order to cascade structured counseling services to the entire population will enhance the effectiveness of anti-drug efforts.

In our country, treatment of drug addiction is provided in the form of outpatient or inpatient services. The treatment protocol to be implemented is indicated by the physician and decided in consultation with the individual concerned. At this stage, the individual is first detoxed from the substance and supported with psychosocial programs and the treatment is maintained. Outpatient services in drug addiction treatment are becoming increasingly widespread across the globe. However, the perception that addiction treatment is provided solely through inpatient programs is still strong in our country. Yet, drug addiction can be treated through inpatient services in line with the treatment plan prescribed by a physician and in a way to allow the patient to arrange his/her life and environment.

Efforts to enhance the capacities of treatment centers for facilitating access to drug addiction treatment are underway. In this context, there have been 55 outpatient treatment centers and 46 inpatient treatment centers by the end of 2017. New centers are included in the investment plan.

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In addition to these special treatment centers, psychiatry clinics were enhanced to offer addiction treatment, thereby facilitating access to treatment system. Psychiatry specialists and child/adolescent mental health specialists in psychiatry clinics in 81 provinces were given training on addiction treatment.

In-service training of the staff working at addiction treatment centers is underway within the scope of the refresher training program. Furthermore, addiction treatment services started to be provided free of charge, regardless of the number of days for which health insurance premium is paid and/or any health insurance premium unpaid, so that our citizens can benefit from treatment services. The Naltrexone subcutaneous implant, which is globally used to manage opioid dependence, was previously not reimbursed by the Social Security Institution, but now included in the reimbursement scheme. In-service training programs were launched for the staff working at emergency wards and 112 emergency hotline.

As a result of these efforts, increases in the number of patients seeking drug addiction treatment were observed. In line with the target of maintaining this increase in the short term, making it constants in the medium term, and decreasing the substance abuse rates in the long term, declines in applications for treatment are targeted.

But, for the realization of these targets, the individuals who are receiving treatment should be supported with rehabilitation and reintegration services. The provision of reintegration services has already commenced. However, due to lack of easy transition between treatment and reintegration and for the prevention of relapse, the rehabilitation stage should be strengthened.

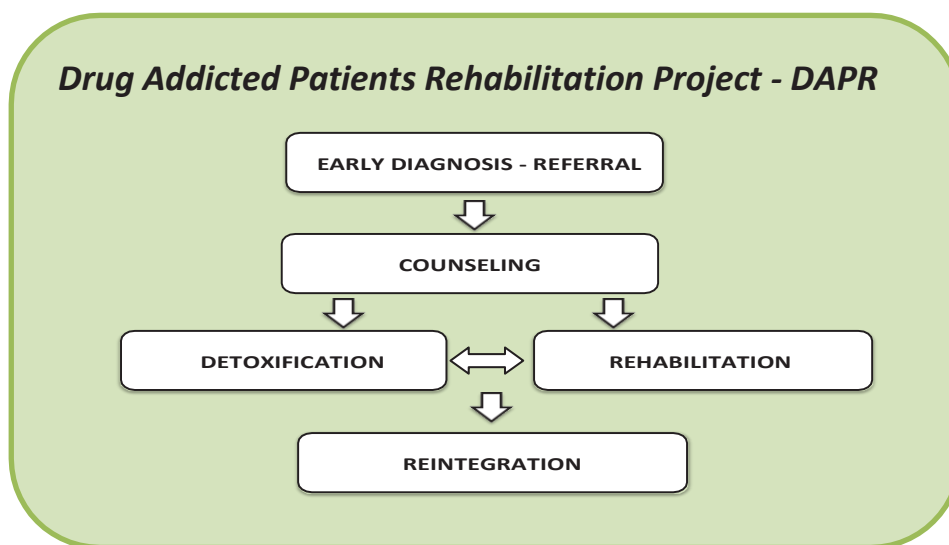
Rehabilitation and supporting individuals against changes in quality of their lives and difficulties they encounter after diseases, accidents or similar events are complementary to their treatment. The aim here is to ensure that people can maintain their lives in a healthy manner.

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The rehabilitation process in the drug addiction process aims to prevent people who have received treatment from resuming drug use and averting their social exclusion or stigmatization. In the rehabilitation period, patients are expected to acquire skills to motivate themselves for a better life and be beneficial to society and enhance their expectations for the future and be able to say "no" in a way to save their lives.

Treatment should maintain its integrity by ensuring that patients are not isolated from social life, and they can re-adapt to social life and are able to remain clean as long as possible and avoid resumption of drug use. For these reasons, efforts to develop and scale up rehabilitation services will be accelerated.

During the rehabilitation period, reintegration services will be provided after patients acquire the basic skills specified. The scaling up of reintegration services which are currently piloted in four centers<sup>14</sup> is targeted. In these units, patients are expected to be drug-free and attend the reintegration programs voluntarily.



#### **DAPR Project**

*The DAPR project has been implemented to support people with dependence spiritually, help them maintain their social, family and professional roles and ensure their well-being. Under this project, outpatient and long-term inpatient rehabilitation centers will be opened based on the needs. Upon completion of the detoxification stage, patients will be taken to these centers and included in 3-month, 6-month or 1-year long term programs depending on their needs. These centers will also conduct post-rehabilitation follow-up for at least one year, and medical treatment, individual counseling, group work, family group work, social skills training, psychoeducation, are occupational activities are planned for these centers.*

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The aim is to improve existing programs, measure their effectiveness and update as necessary and develop new programs in needed areas. Coordination among institutions is a priority in order to achieve all strategies and activities developed for prevention of demand for drugs.

## Prevention of Demand for Drugs

## 2.1. Aim of Prevention of Demand for Drugs

To inform and raise aware of target groups about harmful effects of drugs; facilitate access of drug addicts and their relatives to counseling, treatment and rehabilitation units; ensure that drug addicts are treated and rehabilitated to become individuals who are beneficial to society through reintegration mechanisms.

### 2.3.1 Protective and Preventive Services

#### 1. Measure the effectiveness of all programs targeting society and scale up based on the results

- ✓ Measure the effectiveness of all existing training programs,
- ✓ Develop and update new applications and materials within the scope of training programs,
- ✓ Integrate APTP interactive materials into Education Informatics Network (EIN),
- ✓ Add the module "Combating Addiction" to the training courses given in community training centers,
- ✓ Ensure that the branches of the Turkish Green Crescent Society give training courses to adults in cooperation with the provincial national education directorates,
- ✓ Undertake virtual classroom training in cooperation with local and foreign experts,
- ✓ Raise awareness and conduct scaling-up efforts by providing training to selected volunteers among traders within the scope of the "Health Ambassadors Project",
- ✓ Deliver the training module on anti-drug efforts for the owners and employees of the establishments in the catering and entertainment sector, particularly including those offering alcoholic drinks and with intense social contact,
- ✓ Create anti-drug volunteer programs,
- ✓ Provide information on anti-drug efforts through several methods including religious discourses, special proselytization sessions, conferences seminars, panels etc.,

### 3. Communication in Anti-Drug Efforts

It is of crucial important to boost the effectiveness of the anti-drug efforts by informing the public of the activities conducted in that regard. Currently, the President regularly informs the public of the progress made in the anti-drug efforts. In addition, health reporters from media outlets are briefed about the anti-drug efforts with a view to provide correct information to the public and raise awareness of the public about the matter.

The anti-drug communication strategy in this document consists of target audience, the aims sought and means of communication preferred. Within this framework:

- ✓ It will be ensured that all citizens are properly informed about the hazards of drug abuse and the public awareness is raised about them through local and national media outlets.
- ✓ Wrong or missing information about the hazards of drug abuse will be eliminated by providing training to the public.
- ✓ In addition, efforts should be conducted to raise awareness of the press about the matter. In this scope, an effective communication strategy planning is made.
- ✓ Planning compatible communication processes, developing an effective and proper rhetoric, holding opinion polls when needed and relations with the media are other components of the process.
- ✓ To ensure that the process is managed in a professional manner and resources are correctly allocated and successful feedback is received, all stages should be treated as a communication campaign. This process has completely been managed by a committee of experts in their field like communication professionals, public relations experts, journalists, and psychologists, and to this end, a Scientific Commission on Communication has been set up.
- ✓ Press conferences will be held about the new steps to taken to inform the public and the effectiveness and accessibility of the activities will be improved through a "Communication Strategic Document" that will enter into force.

To keep social consciousness alive through activities that would consider our country's cultural structure is also targeted. The activities for communication with the public will be used to reinforce the way cultural transmission which is one of the communication methods.

## 3.1 Aim of Communication in Anti-Drug Efforts

To define the outlines of a general communication strategy which will represent a common perspective for all stakeholders and ensure joint action in anti-drug efforts, follow up and audit the activities within this framework, and raise public awareness about the activities conducted.

### 3.3. Initiatives and Activities of Communication in Anti-Drug Efforts

1. **Prepare the Anti-Drug Joint Strategy and Communication Guide containing communications, methods, contents, concepts, language, styles, narrative structure, action plan and strategies for anti-drug efforts as a source of reference and joint action for the public and all stakeholders involving in anti-drug efforts**
  - ✓ Establish a Scientific Commission on Communication and task it with the preparation of the Guide,
  - ✓ Reproduce the Guide and distribute it in printed form and electronically,
  - ✓ Conduct promotion, briefing and training activities for all stakeholders and target groups for the implementation of the guide,
  - ✓ Prepare and deliver face-to-face training,
  - ✓ Prepare electronic training content,
  
2. **Promote the activities conducted within the framework of anti-drug efforts**
  - ✓ Organize periodic meetings with the managers and representatives of mainstream and local media in order to inform about anti-drug efforts,
  - ✓ Enhance recognition of the 191 Anti-Drug Consultation and Support Hotline and promote its branding and ensure that it works in coordination with the Green Crescent Counseling Hotline,

## 4. Coordination, Monitoring and Evaluation of Anti-Drug Process

A critical factor for success in anti-drug efforts is to ensure coordinated work and monitor and evaluate the work undertaken. Therefore, the Anti-Drug Supreme Council, consisting of eight ministers, as well as associated sub-councils were established to ensure strong coordination with the Prime Ministry Circular numbered 2014/19. Under this Circular, the First Anti-Drug Council Meeting was held, and based on the outcomes of this meeting, 2015 Anti-Drug Urgent Action Plan and Anti-Drug Strategic Document and 2016-2018 National Anti-Drug Action Plan and National Anti-Drug Strategic Document entered into force. These activities were described in detail in the 2014-2017 Anti-Drug Activity Report, which is available at [www.saglik.gov.tr](http://www.saglik.gov.tr).

In this process, due to the need for expansion of the scope of the councils, the Prime Ministry Circular dated 9 December 2017 and numbered 2017/23 was issued. Under this Circular, an "Anti-Drug Supreme Council" was formed in 2014 to be presided by a Deputy Prime Minister and consisting of 11 ministers (Minister of Justice, Minister of Family and Social Policies, Minister of Labor and Social Security, Minister of Youth and Sports, Minister of Customs and Commerce, Minister of Internal Affairs, Minister of Finance, Minister of National Education, Minister of Health, and Minister of Transport, Maritime Affairs and Communications). The Circular also provides that the Chairman of the High Council is authorized to set up committees, sub-committees, technical committees, ad hoc and permanent working groups and provincial and district committees. Within this context, the Council of Dependence Prevention and the following technical working groups for dependence prevention were established by the decision of the Chairman dated 23.12.2017 and numbered 71366025-990: Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Tobacco Dependence, Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Drugs, Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Alcohol Dependence, Technical Working Group on the Prevention of Behavioral Dependence (e.g. technology and gambling) and Technical Working Group on Communication in Dependence Prevention, as well as the Provincial/District Coordination Boards for Dependence Prevention, and the procedures and functions of these bodies were also issued.

Also, the Circular has specified that the secretarial services of these bodies as well as coordination and follow-up will be carried out by the Directorate General of Public Health led by the respective Deputy Undersecretary at national level and provincial health directorates led by the governors in the provinces.

In this way, the anti-drug efforts had been reinforced and a new road map for anti-drug efforts has been developed with the action plan and strategic document for the period 2018-2023.

*Coordination, Monitoring and Evaluation of Anti-Drug Process*

In addition, preparations have been made for the activities to be conducted with cooperation between local administrations and CSOs to cascade the centrally-conducted activities to local organizations. With the regional meetings to be conducted in this process, the activities in the provinces will be supported and examples of good practice will be scaled up and the on-the-spot solution of the problems will be ensured.

To observe the results of the anti-drug efforts at the national level and make comparisons between our country and other countries, field studies are conducted among different age groups. The General Population Attitude and Behavioral Survey on Tobacco, Alcohol and Substance Use in Turkey was conducted most recently in 2011 among the general population aged between 15 and 64. According the plans, this survey will be repeated in 2018 and it will be conducted in two-year intervals until 2023 until which anti-drug efforts will be maintained with full momentum. The Survey on Prevalence of Drug Abuse in Students Aged 14-19, whose field implementation was performed in 2017, and the Survey on Prevalence of Drug Abuse in University Students Aged 19-25, which was completed in 2017, will be conducted on an annual basis. These surveys will provide feedback on the effectiveness of the anti-drug efforts and facilitate the annual assessment and follow-up of the 2018-2023 National Anti-Drug Action Plan and Strategic Document.

A work delivery unit will be established subordinated to the secretariat to ensure the monitoring of all these surveys along with indicator targets and regular flow of data from the Ministries / institutions will be maintained. The results of periodical follow-ups will be evaluated to develop new policies and revisions related to indicators/targets will be implemented.

- ✓ Make sure that the Scientific Commission on Combating Drug Supply, the Scientific Commission on Drug Demand and the Scientific Commission on Communication regularly hold meetings to provide the scientific support needed by the boards for anti-drug efforts,
- ✓ Seek the approval of the scientific commissions before using all materials designed to inform the public such as training and communication materials,

**7. Support civil society organizations, platforms, federations, etc., which conduct anti-drug efforts, and enhance the effectiveness of anti-drug efforts of local organizations**

- ✓ Sign protocols on cooperation concerning anti-drug efforts with local administrations in line with the priorities and needs of provinces/districts,
- ✓ Speed up and prioritize area allocation procedures if any public institution or organization makes a demand for the establishment of counseling, treatment, rehabilitation and reintegration centers,
- ✓ Deliver training for CSOs, platforms, federations, etc.,

*Coordination, Monitoring and Evaluation of Anti-Drug Process*

- ✓ Create financial support programs for CSOs,
- ✓ Promote the establishment of associations with agenda for anti-drug efforts and ensure that the Ministry of Internal Affairs monitor the activities of existing anti-drug associations,
- ✓ Lend support to, and prioritize, social projects on the fight against drug addiction,
- ✓ Finance the projects that seek to prevent dependence and offer post-treatment support services (reintegration, culture, art, healthy lifestyle and sports) within the scope of the Youth Projects Support Program (YPSP).

*All the activities needed to successfully achieve the goal, aims, targets, initiatives and indicators in the Document and responsible institutions and organizations as well as process indicators planned for the follow-up of these activities are specified in the Anti-Drug Action Plan 2018-2023.*
